The market is level. Washington MFC Braeburn, Gala, Golden Delicious, Granny Smith, Fuji, and Red Delicious Apples are available. Quality is very good. The Washington Opal season has ended. Michigan's Golden Delicious, Honeycrisp, and Pink Lady seasons are over, but these varieties are shipping from Washington.

Expect higher green bell prices over the next week. Mexico's Sinaloa season is past peak production, while production in the California desert region is just getting started. Volume is increasing in Northern Florida; the Georgia season will start in two weeks. Although the red bell market is currently low, it's expected to jump up over the next three weeks as volume dips. MFC and ESS Green and Red Bell Peppers are available.

MFC Anaheim, Habanero, Jalapeno, Pasilla, Red Fresno, and Serrano Chile Peppers are available.

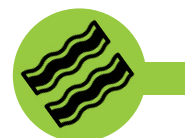

Which dishes do you like to feature for Cinco de Mayo LTOs?

A

I just moved to the Midwest from Texas, where Cinco de Mayo is a major celebration. My favorite ingredients to feature include RSS Avocado Halves, RSS Diced Red Onions, MFC Jalapeno Chile Peppers, RSS Washed & Trimmed Cilantro, and MFC Limes to make the best guacamole ever!



I also use a variety of fruits to make pico de gallo, such as peaches, mangos, watermelon, or strawberries. However, my absolute favorite is salsa fresca made with ripe MFC Tomatoes, RSS Diced Onions, MFC Bell Peppers, RSS Peeled Garlic, RSS Washed & Trimmed Cilantro, and a touch of salt.

TIPS FOR SERVING RSS MARGARITA MIX



- 1.** Garnish margaritas with colorful fresh fruit: MFC Strawberries, RSS Pineapple Sections, raspberries, kiwifruit, RSS Cantaloupe Chunks, or papaya.
- 2.** Add RSS Margarita Mix to cheesecake batter; bake and garnish with RSS Orange Rounds.
- 3.** In a blender, mix sweetened condensed milk, RSS Margarita Mix, and MFC Strawberries; fold in whipped cream; pour into graham cracker crust and freeze pie.

RSS Kale Color Crunch and Shrimp Tostadas

The crunch and subtle sweetness of RSS Kale Color Crunch is the perfect base for these spicy shrimp and creamy guacamole.

- 4 Tostada rounds
- 16 Large shrimp, peeled and cleaned
- 1 tsp. Cumin, ground
- 1 tsp. Cayenne
- 1 tsp. Salt
- 1/2 C RSS Washed & Trimmed Cilantro, split in two portions
- 1/4 C Canola oil
- 1 C RSS Kale Color Crunch
- 4 T RSS Pico de Gallo Guacamole

Arrange tostada rounds on serving plates. Hand mix RSS Kale Color Crunch with house-made lime vinaigrette; set aside. Toss shrimp with cumin, cayenne, salt, and 1/4 cup of cilantro. Heat oil in a large skillet then add shrimp. Cook until just done (make sure not to overcook). Top tostada rounds with a heaping portion of RSS Kale Color Crunch, then four shrimp, and finally one tablespoon of guacamole. Sprinkle remaining cilantro over tostadas. Serve immediately.
